

Arvada Transportation Advisory Committee meeting
October 22, 2025 5:30 pm

1. Public Comments

- a. No public comments.

2. Minutes Approval

- a. Dan Roussin moved to approve the minutes. Jesse Dubin seconded the motion. The minutes were approved unanimously.

3. TAC Introduction to 2025 Candidates for the City Council

- a. Jadwiga Brown provided an overview of the TAC's previous efforts, successes, and ongoing work.
- b. [City Council Candidates](#) attended the TAC meeting, including Rebecka Lovisone (District 3), Eric Bodenstab (District 1), and Michael Griffith (at-large).
- c. Committee members discussed transportation system challenges, including:
 - i. Sidewalks
 - 1. Lovisone discussed increasing sidewalk widths.
 - 2. Griffith discussed the challenge of adding sidewalk infrastructure.
 - ii. Roundabouts
 - 1. All candidates were generally supportive depending on the circumstances.
 - iii. Road conditions
 - 1. All candidates discussed citizens' concerns about road conditions.
 - 2. Please note: [City Council](#) voted to increase the road repair budget for next year only.
 - iv. Arvada transit, connector, or circulator
 - 1. Candidates discussed improving last-mile connectivity.
 - 2. Griffith discussed the possibility of a transit pilot program and improving connectivity between northwest Arvada and other areas.
 - v. Multi-modal travel
 - 1. Griffith discussed challenges associated with biking as a commuting option.
 - 2. Lovisone discussed increasing signage, conditions, making other forms of other travel easier.
 - 3. Lovisone discussed improving bike security at the location.
 - vi. Fees/permitting
 - 1. Griffith discussed addressing land use, housing density, and traffic as a multi-part problem.
 - vii. Why run for office?
 - 1. Griffith discussed his experience on the planning commission and in urban planning. Griffith discussed his passion for improving infrastructure.

2. Lovisone discussed her interest in being a bridge between citizens and the city. She discussed improving the safety of biking and waterways.
3. Bodenstab discussed his enjoyment of engaging with Arvada residents.

4. City Updates - Kellee Van Bruggen, Derek Fern

a. [DRCOG Regional Transportation Plan Solicitation Process.](#)

- i. Arvada has one existing project (Indiana between 52nd and 86th) within the current 2050 RTP which requires a resubmittal for evaluation.
- ii. Arvada is part of two subregional forums: Jefferson County and Adams County.
- iii. Submitted projects:
 1. Adams County:
 - a. Sheridan Boulevard Trail
 2. Jefferson County:
 - a. Indiana Street (64th to 96th)
 - b. 80th Street (Indiana to Kipling)
 - c. SH-72 (SH-93 to Indiana)
 - d. 72nd Avenue widening (Indiana to Simms)
 - e. Ralston Road complete street (Ralston/58th and Kipling)
 - f. Alkire (80th to 86th)
- iv. Golden and Wheat Ridge have submitted projects adjacent to Arvada
- v. Timeline:
 1. Review panel scheduled for November

b. Parking

- i. Walker Parking Consultants have completed Olde Town parking data collection and are compiling the data
 1. Data will be used to determine model for next year's parking program
- ii. 2nd Year Budget request
 1. City Council budget request includes:
 - a. Internal Parking Ambassador staff
 - b. New back-up vehicle
- iii. Budget approved at 10/21 City Council Meeting
- iv. Pay plan to be approved on November 11th City Council Meeting for wages for Parking Supervisor and Parking Ambassadors

c. Bike Training Course

- i. Working with on-call to develop a toolkit to enhance facility
- ii. Working with CU Denver graduate planning class to work on:
 1. Building out a bicycle network connecting to the course
 2. Piloting new striping on existing facility
 3. Developing curriculum for the course elements
 4. Biking event at Bike Training Course from 12 p.m. to 2 p.m. on October 25th
 - a. 5150 Allison Street

- b. Enter from Yarrow St. or the Interurban Trail
- c. Parking available at HeadStart

5. Election of Officers

- a. Lydia Meyer (current secretary) was nominated for the Secretary by Jadwiga Brown, ran unopposed, and was elected unanimously.
- b. Dan Roussin was nominated for Vice Chair by Jadwiga Brown, ran unopposed, and was elected unanimously.
- c. Jesse Dubin was nominated for Chair by Jadwiga Brown, ran unopposed, and was elected unanimously.
- d. Newly elected officers will assume their positions in January.
