3. Updates from City Traffic Engineer-Michael Koslow

- a. New traffic engineers have been hired
- b. 99 traffic signals in Arvada that city operates
- c. 20 pedestrian signals
- d. This year, traffic engineers have been working on connecting signals to the fiber optic network to improve corridor timing
 - i. 80% are now connected
- e. New signal at 93rd and Candelas
- f. Rebuilt signal at Kipling and Allendale
- g. Funding of signals is primarily provided by federal grants and CDOT
- h. 63rd and McIntyre
 - i. Rectangular rapid crossing
- i. 64th and Easley
- j. Speed management program starting next year
- k. New timing on 80th, 64th, 58th, 84th
- l. Arvada does not have a bucket truck to do signal maintenance
- m. Safe Routes to School with 6th Elementary school

- a. Transportation update and Jefferson County Parkway presentation at City Council on 12/8
- b. Parking update:
 - 1. Walker Parking Consultants analyzed data collected during parking enforcement hours
 - 2. Collected data after 7 p.m.
 - 3. Will return with paid parking models next year
 - ii. 2nd Year Budget request approved
 - 1. Request includes:
 - a. Parking program creation
 - b. New back-up vehicle

 - i. Top area for missing sidewalks is Oberon Road

 - i. Looking to apply in 2026 ahead of a Bike Master Plan Update
 - ii. Work through questions and concerns regarding ongoing maintenance of on-street bike facilities
 1. Posts, painting, etc.
 - iii. Development of maintenance plan
 - e. Bike Lane Improvements
 - i. Tackling as part of the 2026 pavement program
 - f. Planning department is kicking off comprehensive plan
 - i. In the interview phase for consultants
 - g. Climate and Sustainability Action Plan
 - i. Draft is ready for public comments
 - h. DRCOG put out December agenda to discuss regional transportation plan draft
 - i. Vote will likely vote in January-February timeframe on projects
 - ii. Indiana Street corridor for 64th to 98th
 - iii. Ralston Road complete streets project
 1. Provides enhancements for bike facilities and transit
 - iv. Sheridan improvements
 1. Side path project in TSP
