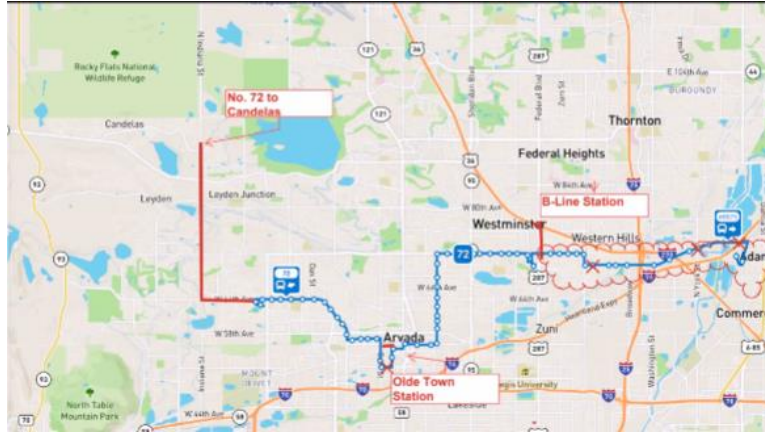

 - a. ADA Transition Plan - Ann Foster (5:45-6:30)
 1. Ann Foster discussed the development of the plan as a framework to prioritize projects for improving accessibility.
 2. Areas covered by the plan:
 - a. Public buildings
 - b. Right-of-way
 - c. Parks and recreation
 - d. Programs and services
 - e. Communication and engagement
 3. ADA priorities for barrier removal:
 - a. Accessible entrance
 - b. Access to goods and services
 - c. Access to public toilet rooms
 - d. Other items (water fountains, hand sanitizer station)
 4. Public input is necessary to identify real-world barriers
 5. TAC members discussed:
 - a. Jurisdiction of bus stops.
 - i. Bus stops are covered under [PROWAG](#)
 - b. Removal of curb ramps
 6. Members recommended:
 - a. A committee of disabled people to comment on the plan
 - b. Engineering flexibility
 7. Members can pass feedback to Ann via Derek Fern.
 - b. 72nd Ave Underpass Update - Chris Lisberg (6:40-7:00)
 - i. The City recommends canceling the underpass project and reevaluate options.
 - ii. This applies to 72nd Ave. between Kipling and Simms.
 - iii. Phase (CP-3) cost is \$80M
 - iv. Unit prices have increased significantly.
 - v. \$63M gap
 - vi. Next steps:
 1. Public open house February 2
 2. Prepare the 2026 plan to take project out of interim conditions
 3. Evaluate at-grade widening

- vii. \$31M remains
- viii. 72nd Avenue is an ARTERIAL under the National Highway System
- 5. RTD #72 Recommendations - Jon Girand (7:00-7:10)
 - a. Jon Girand recommends changes to the 72 RTD route to increase ridership.
 - b. Ridership is 15 riders/bus.
